## **Umerkot at a Glance**

Umerkot District remained a part of former Tharparkar district and as such in history is akin to the history of Tharparkar in particular and to the history of lower Sindh in general.

Umerkot means the fort of Umer or of the Sumera and tradition ascribes as founding to Jam Umer, the first king of the Sumeras. Its historical importance is due to its position on the main route to Sindh from eastward. Through this town Akber when emperor marched in 1591 to conquer Sindh. In 1813 Umerkot was captured by the the Talpur Mirs from he Raja of Jodhpur (India), in whose possession it had been for some time and after their in 1843 it passed to the British. Umerkot was the headquarter during the dynasty of Talpur, Kalhoras and Rajput 's and was the important city in the Kolhora period.

Umerkot is very famous at world level because of love story Umer & Marvi and the historical Fort (Umer Jo Kot). It has the birthplace of Akber the famous Mughal emperor. Love story Moomal Rano also belongs to the District Umerkot as well. The chief town and District headquarters is situated in 25-22 north latitudes and 69-47 east longitudes. It lies on the confines of the sand hill forming the eastern desert. It is at a distance of about 16 kilometers from Chhore station and about 23 kilometers from Dhoronaro station. It connected with Mirpurkhas with 74 km to the west by road. The town contain a fort, about 46 square meters, the usual garrison of which, when in the possession of the Talpur Mirs was 400 men. The total area of the District is 5608 square kilometers. The district has two distinct portions the irrigated area in the west and north the desert area in the east and south. The eastern Nara canal is the demarcation line between two regions. The fusion of the two is clearly marked towards south at Umerkot, one can see the sand hill spreading towards east which consist of barran tracts of sand dunes covered with thorny bushes. The ridges are irregular and roughly parallel, that they can often enclose shelter valleys, above which they rise to a height of some forty-six meters. Towards west are the alluvial plains with vast stretches of vegetation.

Umerkot is very famous at world level because of its sandy hills and very much attractive place for the tourist during the rainy season.

No heed paid on the historical places as alive the culture and historical places.

It is humbly submitted that the sites of Umerkot just need our attention for research and bringing their historical importance among masses globally.

District Umerkot is mostly dominated by the devotees (MUREED) of Pir Perpaghara.

Umerkot occupies unique place in the socio culture of the Indus valley civilization. It is one of the Districts, that boundaries are touched to the very big desert.

First time Umerkot was created independent District in 1993. Before it was the Tehsil/Taluka of District Mirpurkhas. But due to Political crises District Umerkot was abolished in 2000 and merged into the District Mirpurkhas as a Tehsil.

After some time like mind and social activist of the Umerkot realized that they are not getting a benefit as Tehsil in the context of development schemes, education, jobs and other sectors. Therefore, they had started agitation for the independent District and successfully, Umerkot again restored as District in December 2004.

### **Culture, Customs and Traditions of District Umerkot**

The poor economic conditions have restricted the people for social and economic development. Religious people are revered and Piri Murshadi systems prevail in the district. Usually illiterate people of this district have got perfect and blind faith in the Pirs, but those people who are literate they haven't faith on these things. The cultural pattern of the population in general has not changed much and every tribe or race has a customary outlook on life. Women largely communicate within their own caste where they marry exclusively. In the district, Rajput families are stricter for the purdha as compare to other caste of Hindu.

In irrigated part of the district, usually Sindhi culture is observed. However with the education enhancement and modern communication facilities the old tradition and custom have considerably been changed among a portion of the society.

### **Population of District Umerkot**

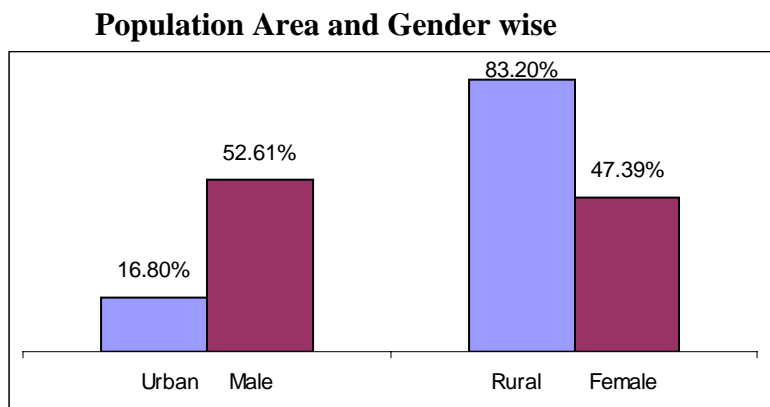
Economically, the District Umerkot depicts its very deplorable picture for being counted as the District having 82% population living below the poverty line. Its geographical sanctity has brought it in the status of one of desert largest District of Sindh Province. At instant, it comprises of four talukas with while stretch boundaries of Thar. Kunri one of the Taluka of District Umerkot is very popular because of its Chilies (Murch) production it is also known as the "International Chili Market".

District Umerkot also coincides its boundaries with India the neighboring country of Pakistan. The population of District sex wise as well as urban and rural areas wise is as under.

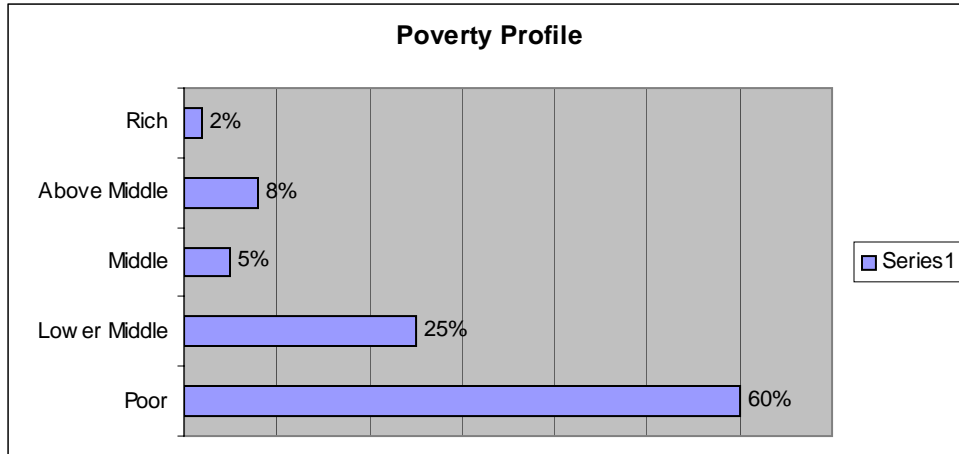

### **Occupation / Livelihood of the People of District**

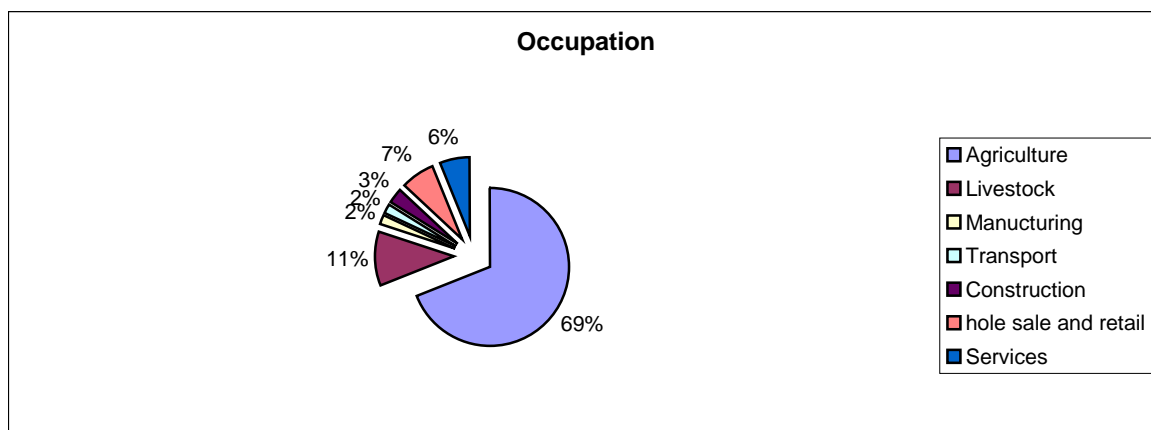
If we look at the graphic chart and analyzed the population in the context of the above graph, majority of the people of the District are living in the rural areas. Only cities of Umerkot, Samaro, Kunri and Pithoro have the urban areas. The rural areas are the agro based and the main source of the common man of livelihood is farming/cultivation or keeping the cattle. In the desert areas mostly people depend on the rains for the cultivation. At present the scarcity of water has further made the life miserable. Mostly the population of the District is living in the rural and very few people are living in the urban areas. The population residing in the rural areas are almost engaged in the agriculture are the fields relating to agriculture, but the major avenue of their livelihood is livestock and cultivation.



A recent initiative of micro financing by the Government as well as by the local NGOs has to some extent engaged people in small business, which is also good initiative which support the rural people to initiate their small business at local/village level independently. In the urban areas people have the variety of the daily wages working opportunities as well as to work in the different departments and the sources of labouring also quite sustainable in Urban areas and they could earn more money that the rural areas. From the density of population point of view Umerkot is one of low middle class economic District, but apart from well spread **desert boundaries** the remaining portion of District Umerkot is fertilized. The green belt of Umerkot with the cultivation of wheat, cotton, sugarcane, orchards of different kinds, accepted to be the richest in agricultural in Sindh.

To enhance the economical status of the people of Umerkot, in this regard District Government has taken the initiative under the leadership Fakir Maghan Mangrio District Nazim and DCO Umerkot to boast up the economical stability of District and create more vistas to bring the prosperity in the life of common masses.

## **Sindh Devolved Social Services Programme (SDSSP) in District Umerkot.**

The Devolved Social Services Program was initiated in District Umerkot with the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between Sindh Government and District Government Umerkot. 24<sup>th</sup> February 2006. Mr. Israr Ahmed Malik Secretary Finance Government of Sindh and Fakir Maghan Mangrio District Nazim Umerkot is respectively the represented Respective Government sectors for signing this MoU. After signing the MoU, Annual Sector Plan Health and Education for the year 2004-5 & 2005-6 were prepared jointly for the both years and submitted to the PSU by the departments respectively and approved in December 2006.

### **The Establishment of Local Support Unit (LSU) at District level:**

The Implementation of devolution plan with the adaptation of Sindh Local Government Ordinance the District found self – Governance set up from upper to lower hierarchy. The District Government at top the Talukas at middle and Union Council set up lower level has also brought the system of distribution of power in a new orientation. To further cement this programme and strengthening the capacity of different organs within District, Sindh Devolved Social Services Programme (SDSSP) has established the Local Support Unit (LSU) in every District of Sindh to frequently liaison with different departments at District level. The important task were assigned to the LSU were to coordinate, facilitate and provide the technical support to the District Government from the planning to the implementation of the programme. The Local Support Unit Office is working in District Umerkot from July 2006 with Finance and Governance Specialist to carry on the SDSSP activities and more importantly providing the facilitation and technical support to the District Government at all levels.

The LSU of District Umerkot has good liaison and coordination with District Government, Line Departments and four Talukas of the District at all levels. The LSU Umerkot is very thankful of District Nazim and District Coordination Officer for their cooperation and in the completion of SDSSP work on time. The continuous support from Executive District Officer Finance and Planning, Executive District Officer Health and Education also played vital role in the completion of the assigned activities.

### **SDSSP Conditional ties for the accessing and Utilization of Conditional Grant**

As it was discussed in the meetings and signed in the MoU that the SDSSP grants could not be Utilized with own their interest but it will be used as signed in the MoU . The SDSSP program has given autonomous status to utilize the conditional grants. First of all, activities should be need based and prioritized and while utilizing the conditional grants. The salient features of the Conditional ties are as under:

- ✓ District Government/TMA must sign MoU
- ✓ Preparation of ASPs is binding
- ✓ No scheme shall be above than 5.7 million
- ✓ Funds will be utilized in Health and Education sector in Health sector the scope ranges from community health worker to District Hospital.
- ✓ District will use conditional grant in the first instance for rationalization, operationalization and rehabilitation of existing schemes.
- ✓ District Government will not use conditional on luxury items
- ✓ District Government will use funds for pro poor and gender balancing projects
- ✓ District Government will follow all the planning, budgeting and approval process.

### **SDSSP Program in District Umerkot for year 2004-5 & 2005-6**

As Umerkot newly established District in December 2004. The District fully functionalized in 2005. After signing of MoU the SDSSP have started the work in District Umerkot. The Annual Sector Plan for Health and Education has been prepared Jointly for the year 2004-5 & 2005-6. The District Umerkot has received the funds for the year 2004-5 & 2005-6.

The break up of SDSSP Financial grant for both sector for 2004-5 & 2005-6 is as under.

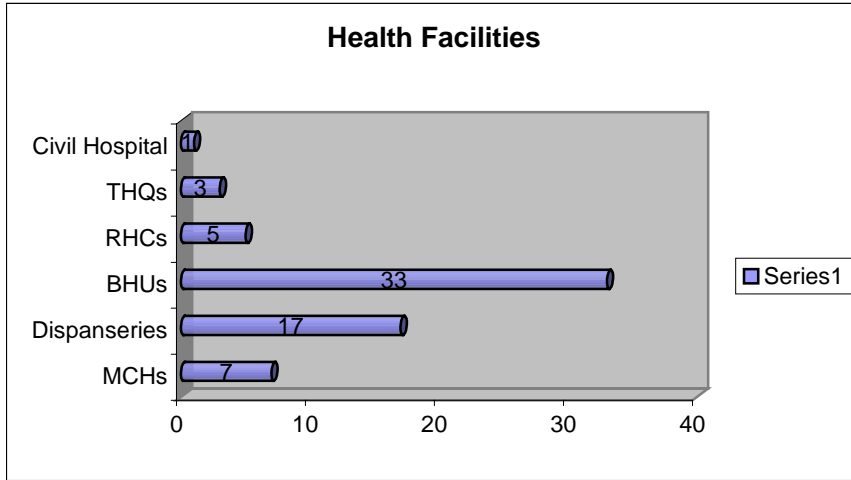

Properly abiding the Sindh Local Government Ordinance the SDSSP grants gave autonomous status to the structure of District Government by using and utilizing the conditional grant by assessing their needs. The District Governments found full autonomy by framing the annual sector plans and assessing their needs and utilizing of grant by keeping their needs. The following schemes have been proposed by health department of the District for the strengthening of Health sector of the District as under:

### **Health Sector**

The Health Sector in District Umerkot is already working; it has a well-stretched network of Government dispensaries 17, Basic Health Units 33, Rural Health Centers 5, Taluka Hospitals 3, Mother Child Health Centers 7 and District Civil hospital 1. These hospitals are facing the lacking of facilities especially lacking of staff in the every health facility. The District Government Umerkot is very much keen to overcome the problem. The District Government appreciating SDSSP program, which supported the health sector with necessary medical facilities, which were lacking in the hospitals since long time. After receiving SDSSP grant health sector fulfilled the basic needs of the rural and for furlong people at doorstep and people are getting lot of benefits from SDSSP support especially they saved their transportation.

**SDSSP Schemes for 2004-5 & 2005-6**

As the District Umerkot established in December 2004, so the District has not received any scheme from SDSSP in the year 2004-5. The District Government Umerkot prepared combined Annual Sector Plan Health for the year 2004-5 & 2005-6. After establishment of Local Support Unit the process of work become swifter. In this regard coordination between District Government and SDSSP local Support Unit resulted in such best way in the context of removed the observation of Annual Sector Plan and submitted 4th draft of the ASP for the approval. The Annual Sector Plan has been approved and the District Government received the grants. The schemes proposed by the Health department and District Government is as under.

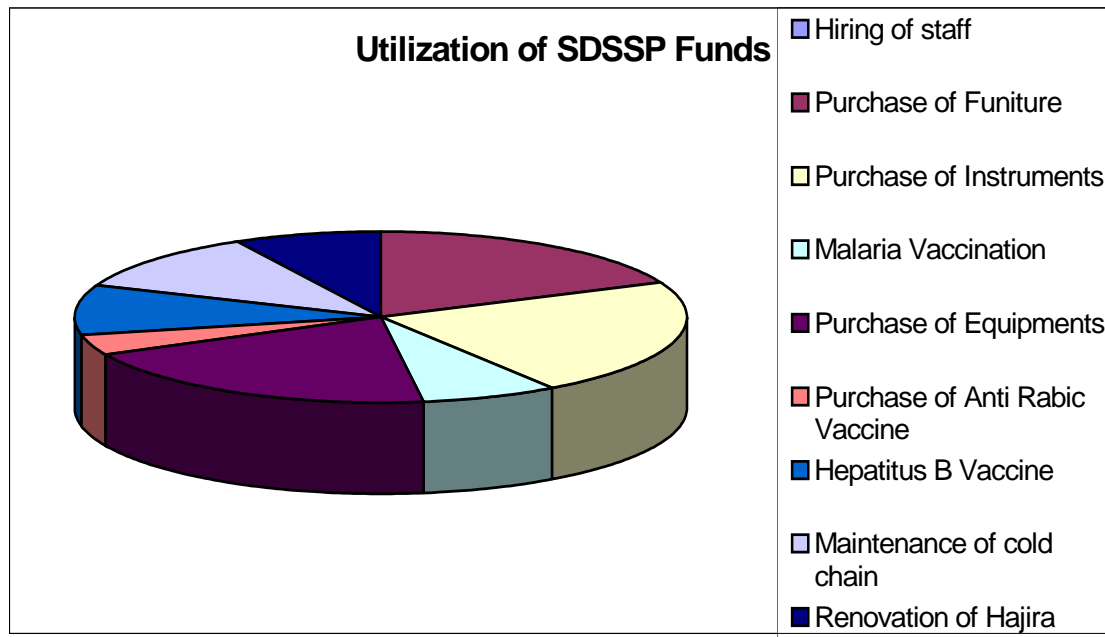

## SDSSP Funds Utilization for the year 2004-5 and 2005-6



After the LSU set up at District level the process of SDSSP schemes maintained as per procedure laid down in the Annual Sector Plan. All planning were as per directed principle. While embarking on the sectoral planning the basic conception of focusing the pro poor areas and gender balancing were given maximum importance. Therefore during the planning ensured women participation and focused on the Gender balance schemes.

### Pro Poor Areas

Keeping the basic needs of rural people in mind the focus was given to the strengthening of BHUs, RHCs and Taluka Hospitals, as people get the more benefit at doorstep easily. In this regard during the identification, assessment and planning mostly focused on those areas/communities who are living in the remote and desert areas where people have not easy access to the Urban areas where they go to visit the BHUs, RHCs and Taluka Hospitals for the treatment. Therefore, SDSSP program had provided the facilities of immunization, hepatitis B vaccination, Tuber clause and Malaria Vaccination to rural people at doorstep, which was the basic need and people are going to use the facilities on regular basis.

### Gender Balancing

During the planning and identification of the schemes the District Government Umerkot has focused on Gender balancing schemes. So for that ensured women participation during the identification and planning as women could get the more benefit from the SDSSP program in the context of recruitment of the female staff as well as to avail the

facilities at their door step. Therefore, schemes were identified through meetings and need based surveys and finalized with consideration of Gender balance schemes. .

### **Monitoring Mechanism:**

The SDSSP is a program which addresses the problems of common masses at grass roots level. The SDSSP has its own monitoring mechanism as monitor the procedure; planning, implementation and utilizations were followed properly. So for that, District Government has the set up of two committees to monitor the SDSSP activities in Health Sector. Which are as under:

### **Council Monitoring Committees**

For the enhancement and strengthening of public and private partnership, Council Monitoring Committee has been formed with the 20% female representation in the committees. The committees responsible to monitor the SDSSP activities and will suggest any ideas, which needed to bring any change according to public demand/need. The detail of committees been attached as Annexure.

To further furnish the monitoring mechanism in this regard different committees were formed and assigned their role and responsibilities accordingly.

District Government has also notified a District Health Monitoring Committee, which will monitor the health activities in the District. This committee has also access to monitor SDSSP activities as well. The committee is comprises of the following members.

### Education Sector

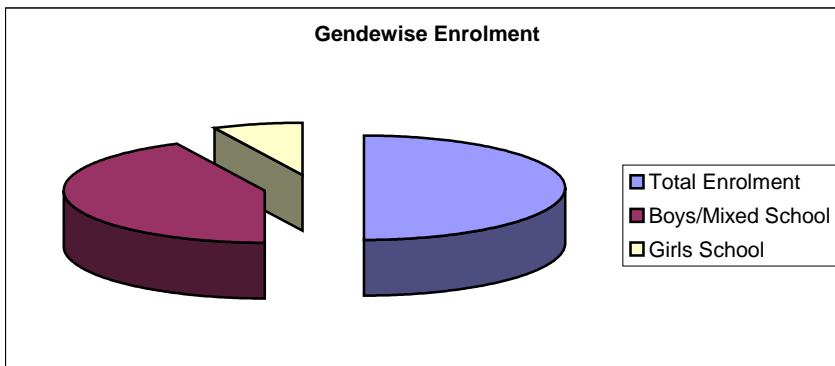
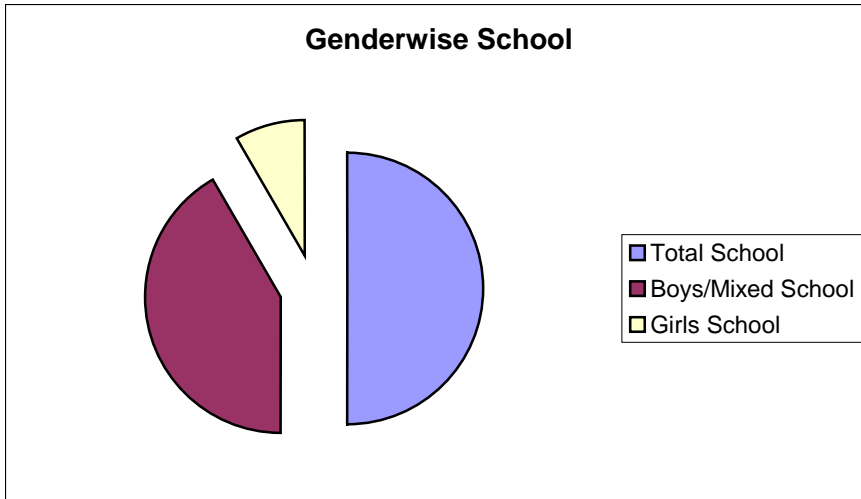
Over all situation of the District in education is not much satisfactory. This District belonging to the Rural and desert areas so the education system of the District is very poor. The literacy rate of the district recorded in the year 1998 was 24.83 percent. The male literacy rate is higher as compare to the female literacy rate, whereas the situation of literacy rate in Rural Urban areas is almost the same but there is little bit difference between urban and rural areas, so the literacy rate of the urban areas is higher as compared to the rural areas.

Before going into SDSSP Programme activities in the Education sector it would be better to described the situation analysis of Education sector in the District.

As there is no concept for the mixed schools, so therefore the schools treated as “Boys” schools but indeed are mixed schools. The below graphic scale will justify the concept of mixed school.



To go deeper to crystallize the gender balance ratio of male and female students studying in the Boys/mixed schools would further clear the situation.

### **SDSSP Schemes 2004-5 & 2005-6**

After the adoption of Sindh Local Government Ordinance and devolution system, District Government Umerkot has maintained its territorial integrity. As the extent of the District is desert. The network of the schools is as spread as the boundaries of the District. Therefore the functionaries of Education Sector had to undergo in big exercise before reaching to those schools, which are located in the desert areas. The Sindh Devolved Social Services Program is aimed to support the service – oriented sectors have focused a lot on Education sector in District Umerkot. Before the planning the basic issues of sector were taken on the priority. After assessment such issues were identified and gave the priorities.

During the identification of the schemes vigorously attention was paid on the selection of the schemes and process. Therefore only the need-based schemes were selected and finalized for the SDSSP program.

During the selection process F & G specialist was in the close coordination with line departments and District Government. While the planning meetings were held with the concerned departments and EDOs for the finalization of the need based schemes. In the result of the meetings

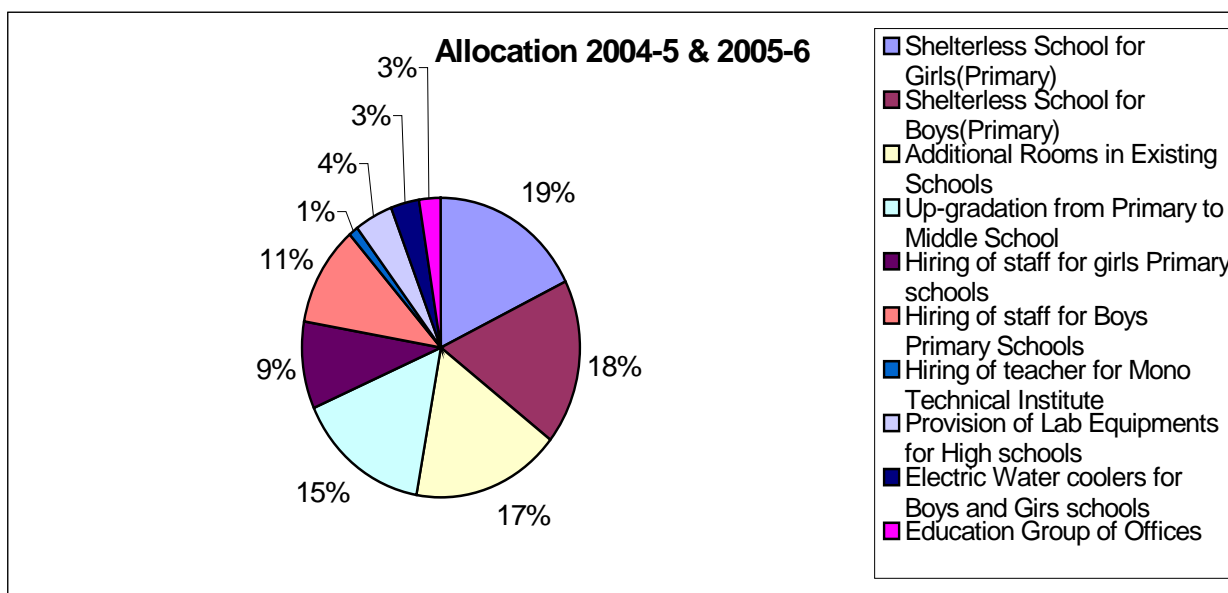

So from the above the schemes abiding of SDSSP conditionalities are very clear. The District Government fully maintained the directives laid down in SDSSP guidelines. During the identification of these schemes the District Government conceded on the grass root level while giving top priority to Primary schools at lower level because these schools are located in the remote areas and strengthen the basic education system. 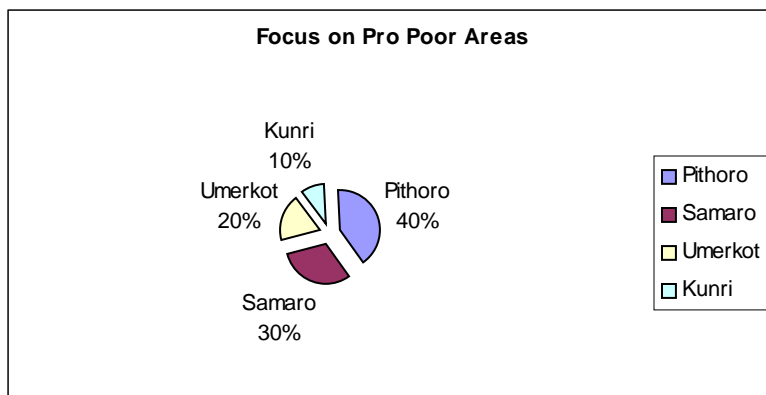
As discussed above the District Government focuses on the pro poor and remote areas, which are lacking the basic amenities of life. To have a school in remote desert is no less than a reward. The education sector while identifying the schemes abided the above criteria and focused on faraway areas. In the result of this selection the weight age went for the primary schools.

The District Government has also given the maximum attention to enhance and strengthen the primary section of the education. After analyzed of the education sector District Government realized that primary is the base of education and if the base is strong the whole edifice will be strong. So mostly the priority was given to the primary education in SDSSP Program.

### **Focus on the Pro Poor Areas**

Keeping in mind to strengthen the education of pro poor areas. In this connection District Government Umerkot and Education department stressed to focus on desert and remote areas, which come in to the category of poor areas. The rural areas all over the District almost the backward areas, they have not the resources of employment, business initiatives or other opportunities as they could change their economical status. Therefore during identification and planning those areas were highlighted for SDSSP programme and have given the more importance to the areas. Taluka Pithoro, Samaro and Umerkot are economically backward areas. The Taluka wise graphic position highlights the focus on pro poor conception.



### **Schemes Selection Criteria**

One of the essential objectives of SDSSP Programme is to strengthen the participatory approach in its every activity. Therefore while embarking on the sectoral planning maximum importance was given to the participatory approach for the selection of the schemes. During the selection process of the schemes consultation from Health, Education sector, consultation with political representatives, Line Departments, suggestions from lower hierarchy were obtained and finalized the schemes. In District Umerkot for the year 2004-5 & 2005-6 all the schemes were identified through survey and the need based and verified with consultation of concerned departments and community meetings. The respective EDOs deputed their lower staff along with District Council members to see the actual position of schemes and later on the with mutual consultation between District Nazim respective EDOs and F & G specialist were finalized the schemes. After the identification of schemes the SDSSP designed the Annual Sector Plan format was adopted and every scheme was measured on as per requirements of the ASP and were finalized for the approval of PSU and District Assembly in light of the requirement enumerated in the ASP.

### **Rationalization of Facilities**

The Annual Sector Plan is the best document design to properly rationalize the schemes. The steps and guide are visible and strictly bound the initiator of schemes to follow the parameters such as no schemes is to be above then 5.7 Million. No luxury item is to be purchased. Such strong prohibitions were abided during the selection and rationalization of facilities. If the schemes of Health and Education sector were observed all are within parameters and need based and there were the acute need of the identified facilities in the area. A provision of M & E Proforma is given in the ASP which witness all the needs identified. So therefore it is easy to examine if the scheme is with in the parameters or not.

## **Planning and Budget Approval Process**

After the process of devolution the District Government have required the self-governance status. The SDSSP has further cemented this process by directly processing funds in District and TMA account 4. This enables both TMA and District Government to realize their autonomous standard and utilized their funds without any political pressure or any other technical issue. This process also strengthen the capacity of TMAs as well as District to have direct access to funds without any pressure.

These funds directly come to District and TMA account where are distributed by District Nazim and Taluka Nazims respectively with mutual consultation of EDO Health, Education and Finance and Planning. After the allocation of funds the PC1 of the schemes were prepared. After the approval of schemes from council District Development Committee accords the final approval and its administrative approval is released. In the year 2004-5 and 2005-6 the steps are strictly followed. The copies of council approval are enclosed herewith.

## **User experience**

While discussing the SDSSP programme its implementation mechanism following District functionaries were contacted. There experience regarding programme is visible from their comments.

### **Q.1. How do you view SDSSP Programme?**

Ans. If we look at the SDSSP Programme it is very good programme specifically at District level. This programme addresses the basic needs and issues of the District as well as encourage to our system to follow the rules. But its process is very lengthy. An other thing that I appreciate that SDSSP has enhance the capacity of the District functionaries in the context of development of Annual Sector Plan and follow the rules strictly.

### **Q.2. How do you view the drawing and disbursement process?**

Ans. As the EDO F &P is the focal person of the programme therefore all the drawing disbursement and sectoral powers should be discuss and share with him. I would suggest that SDSSP should share the TMAs information with EDO F & P as well because he is the focal person and he will be awared about the SDSSP work at TMA level.

**Q.3. How do you feel SDSSP differs from other Donor supported programmes?**

Ans. Absolutely, SDSSP is a fine programme. It has helped the service oriented sector of District and not restricted for the priorities. It allowed for the selection and need-based schemes. Such as Education, Health and TMAs.

**Q.4. What were the capacity constraints of District, while preparing Annual Sector Plan?**

Ans. As the district Umerkot is newly established District, so there is lacking of staff and staff capacity. Despite of capacity constraints, hard working of our staff and support from LSU had made it easy and task was accomplished successfully within time.

**Q.5. How far do you think that involvement of elected representatives in planning process is positive change for development?**

Ans. Yes, absolutely it is positive change. Through the elected representatives we were reached at grass root level and identified actual and need based problem of the rural communities.

**Q.6. What was the process adopted for sectoral bifurcation of SDSSP conditional grant particularly in Education and Health sectors?**

Ans. It is as per Conditionalities of SDSS Programme. The District Nazim bifurcates the conditional grant in the sectors and sector in-charge prioritized/identified schemes in the light of the allocated budget.

**Q.7. Any other suggestion?**

Ans. District Government needs the support and programme should continue till the issues in services sector will resolve. The sectoral planning in Education and should be as per genuine and day to day needs based. Health facilities in rural and faraway areas be given in the priority and hiring of medical staff will more support the health facilities in the District. Education should be enhancing through the computers technical Education be given priority also.

**Q.1. How do you view SDSS Program?**

Ans. SDSS Program is a good program. It fulfills the needs of health facilities, which we could, not provided in the rural areas from the limited budget of the District. Therefore, I would like to say that SDSS Program has solved our problem and we will cover the basic needs of health facilities in all over the District and will over come the future problems.

**Q.2. How do you view the drawing and disbursement process?**

Ans. It is little bit difficult process. It takes long time but I think it is good process and assess people 's willpower. I would suggest that in future make it easy process.

**Q.3. How do you feel SDSSP differs from other Donor supported programs?**

Ans. SDSS Program strengthens the capacity individually to prepare the Annual Sector Plans, which is not required in other donors program. SDSSP Program has given the power to chalk out need based activities and planning by our self and monitor the activities independently.

**Q.4. Any other suggestions?**

Ans. The program facilitated common masses and provided facilities at grass root level and built the capacity at different levels and provided facilities in those areas where we did not provide the facilities from the District budget. For the sustainability of the health facilities in the District I would suggest that program should be extended for long time as effected areas will get more benefit.

**Q.1 How do you view SDSSP?**

Ans. I would like to appreciate this program because independently support to the TMAs without any interference from other sides. It also built the capacity of the staff in the context of development of Annual Sector Plan and identification and selection of the schemes.

**Q.2 How do you view the drawing and disbursement process?**

Its good thing is that TMA funds directly come in TMA account 4 and we use accordingly. So we do not have any difficulty or bothering in any way.

**Q.3 How do you feel SDSS Program differs from other Donor supported programs**

Ans. This program specifically support to the TMAs in WSS sector, which is the basic need of TMAs in rural areas.

**Q.4 Any other suggestion?**

Ans. I would suggest that, the out reach of the program should be increase from TMA to UC level as rural people get ore benefit from the SDSSP Program.

### **Participatory Planning**

To strengthen the participatory approach in the all activities of Sindh Devolved Social Services Program. Keeping views over the importance of the participatory approach LSU Umerkot have involved the community participation at all levels during identification, selection of the schemes and planning process and ensured the community participation in every process.

### **Formation of Council Committees:**

The District Government Assembly is the elected forum of the District. Elected members of the assembly were the representatives from Grass root level. But as they completed their one year period so the District Council Monitoring Committees were dissolved from 27-02-2007 under the notification No: ZNN/UKOT/63 OF 2007 on dated March 1<sup>st</sup> 2007 at District Council Assembly Building Umerkot. New Council Monitoring Committees will be formed soon.

The LSU is in close coordination with District assembly for the formation of new District Council Monitoring Committees.

### **Formation of DPAC**

To enhancing the public private partnership ahead the District Project Appraisal Committee (DPAC) have been formed with the support of District Government. The notification has been issued with no: DCO/C/1123 of 2006 on dated 12-08-2006. DPAC have been comprises of the following members.

- ✓ In education sector the grants will utilized from Kachi to higher secondary classes.
- ✓ As per criteria no scheme is above than 5.7 million.
- ✓ The District Government will not use the conditional grants on luxury items
- ✓ Pro poor areas were focused in the ASP
- ✓ The District Government followed planning, budgeting and approval process.
