Profile

Tando Allahyar is one of the oldest city of sindh. It is situated in between Hyderabad and Mirpurkhas, in the south of Sindh and North of the Arabian Sea. It has its own culture value before April 2005; Tando Allahyar was one of the Taluka of Old District Hyderabad.

Tando Allahyar in addition with his Taluka position, since 4th April 2006 is upgraded to the position of District, having with 2 other Talukas viz. Taluka Chamber and Taluka Jhando Mari.

Physical Features

Taluka Tando Allahyar is situated in between Hyderabad and Mirpur Khas Districts. it surround by Taluka Jhando Mari in the East North, Taluka Chamber in the South East. Whole of the Taluka Tando Allahyar consists of flat lands that is why whole of the Taluka is fertile.. Khesana Canal runs through this area, it irrigates almost whole of the Taluka with the help of several branch canals and water courses.

History

About 600-years ago in the time of Soomra Kingdom, Tando Allahyar came in to being in a position small village with unknown name.

In 1788 A.D, the Kalhora were defeated by Mir Talpurs and the Sindh was divided in seven parts.

Taluka Tando Allahyar was established by a ruler Mir Allahyar Khan Talpur s/o Mir Fateh Ali Khan Talpur during the rule of Talpur.

There is an opinion that old name of Tando Allahyar was "KUNDHI-JI-WASI" (Kandhi was a Rais of this area). Some people say that its old name was Syedabad.

First time Military Cantonment was established and other developments were also made specially in trade sides. In those days Tando Allahyar became famous city of trade. Specially many kinds of cloth were woven i.e. silk and cotton cloth, also many silk made products were introduced. Industry of Cloth Printing, Leather and Ivory were well developed. The trade of Tando Allahyar ran with many other countries. The weavers (cloth makers) were called KORI. The Silk cloths, Cotton cloth, Khadi, Soosi and Garbi were famous in so many countries and the trade ran with these countries.

In 1783 A.D. the Kalohira were defeated by MIR TALPURS and the Sindh was divided in seven parts by the MIRS so that easily could be ruled and Tando-Allahyar came in the share of Mir Fateh Ali Khan Talpur (Awal), Who became the first ruler of state Tando Allahyar out of seven states of Sindh. After his death his elder son Mir Allahyar Khan was crowned. He established it in a new way in 1791 A.D. and a Mud Kila was constructed for the residence purpose as well as capital city which is still present in ruined condition. Now the city was called Tando Allahyar after his name.

Tando Soomro is called as such because of Soomras, who were the followers of Hazrat Shaikh Moosa (Now there is one UC with the name of Shaikh Moosa). Shaikh Moosa is buried in Tando Soomro. It is said that Shaikh Moosa was a close associate of Shah Abdul Latif.

Climate

The climate of Taluka TandoAllahyar is normal and pleasant. Neither hot enough and nor cold enough in winter. The hottest months of summer are June and July while the coldest months of winter are December and January. Hot winds blow from May to August from South/ West to North/ East while cold winds blow from North to South in November, December and January. The nights of District TandoAllahyar are very pleasant and are famous all over Pakistan as well as in the world.

Festivals:

Several annual festivals are celebrated in District Tando Allahyar. Among these RAMA PIR MELA is very popular. Thousands of people gather from all over the country specially the people belonging to Hindu religion. Bare footed people travel from long distances to visit this Mela. A huge trade runs during the festival and a great entertainment activities are arranged for the visitors of the Mela.

Other Famous Festivals of the Areas

- Mouj Darya Mela is celebrated at Tando Allahyar city.
- Miyoon Whyoon Mela is celebrated near Usmaan Shah ji Huri.
- Sheikh Mosa Mela is celebrated near Bhural Shah Village.
- Pak Singhar Mela is celebrated at Pak Singhar.
- Many other Melas are celebrated at Bukera Sharif and other places.

Agriculture

Due to normal climate and wafer supply of canal water every type of agricultural crops are heavily cultivated in this area, Specially Cotton, Wheat, Sugar Cane, and all types of fruits and vegetables, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Tomato, Okra, Radish, Spinach, Chillies, Onion, Oil Seeds, Soyabeen, Sunflower, Fodder etc. The Mangos of TandoAllahyar are famous all over the country.

Geographically, it lies in 25°27 north latitude and 78°42 east longitude. It is located on Tando Allahyar and Tando Ghulam Ali Road. Taluka Chamber is surrounded by Taluka Tando Allahyar, District Badin, District Hyderabad and District Mirpurkhas.

Winter begins with the month of November and is not severe. January is the coolest month, the lowest temperature recorded was 1.1°C. the mean maximum and minimum temperature for this month are 25.04°C and 1.108°C respectively. On the whole, the direction of winds during the winter is from north and northwest.

Humidity varies, with highest figures (65%) about the end of August and lowest (41%) in April.

Dry, Windy, Semi Humid. The climate of Taluka Chambar is normal and pleasant. Neither hot enough and nor cold enough in winter. The hottest months of summer are June and July while the coldest months of winter are December and January. The TMO Chamber expressing his views appreciated the Devolved Social Services Program. He suggested that 100% of the allocated funds might be released at a time in order to achieve timely development, without any hindrances.

TMO Jhando Mari appreciated the program and suggested in the interest of the poor Beneficiaries, that this program might continue at least for 10 years, so that the Deprived people of Sindh Province, can receive benefit from such social services.

Concluding Comments

- According the views of the beneficiaries, it is very beneficial program for the poor people of Taluka and Sindh.
- The WSS Sector has not spent SDSSP grant on luxury items for personal use of officials.
- The Sectors has been investing the SDSSP grant mostly on rehabilitation schemes.
- The Sector has not invested more than 5.7 million from SDSSP funds on any Scheme / Unit.
- The Sector has not made any recruitment from SDSSP Grant as yet.
- The Monitoring Committees has to be more active and play their active role. The meetings in this respect are being conducted with the Monitoring Committees.
